PROJECT GUIDELINES

1. Open to all exhibitors living in Sanilac County.
2. All exhibits must have been produced by the exhibitors this year or in previous year.
3. No premium will be paid on articles not listed.
4. No premium will be paid unless the article merits it, regardless of premium listed below and even if there is no competition.
5. Grain may be exhibited as sheaves, in 1 peck boxes or in wide-mouth glass or clear plastic 1 gallon jars. Sheaves for all grain must be between 24- 30 inches in total length. Sheaves must be 4 inches in diameter (across) at the widest point. Leaves must be stripped. Sheaves are to be tied in 3 places- near the top, in the middle and near the bottom. Note: No other size or amount of grain will be accepted except peck boxes or full 1 gallon jars.
6. Cured hay must be exhibited in a 4-inch bale slice that is put in a **sealed** plastic garbage bag.
7. Each exhibit will receive a 1st- 6th placing ribbon according to judge's determination and premiums will be awarded to 1st- 3rd places.
8. Sugar beet displays must consist of three beets of uniform conformity, mounted with a single heavy wire (preferably a straightened coat hanger with the end crimped). The taproot should be intact and the root hairs removed. The beets should have NO sprangles or hollow crowns. Leaf petioles should be removed flush with the surface of the beet. The crown should be silver dollar size or smaller and horizontal to the root. All dirt must be removed being careful to avoid damaging the outer skin of the beet.
9. The largest single sugar beet displays should have all dirt and tops removed. Sprangles and root hairs should remain and a wire mounting is not required. Only 1st, 2nd & 3rd places will be awarded based on weight of the root.

7. The five runner-ups of the Homemaker contest will receive a \$50.00 premium, paid after the fair, and a plaque.

8. Homemakers must be present to be considered for the top six awards. Entrants who are unable to attend will have their certificate mailed.

SANILAC COUNTY 4-H FAIR HOMEMAKER RULES

7. Gold Ribbons should be displayed with your exhibit. **Remember to write your name on the back of the ribbon tag. Do not include additional ribbons.** Label all exhibits and if more than one piece in an exhibit (i.e. sets) label each piece and attach together with a pin or string. It is advisable to have identification on the inside of a garment as well as on all still exhibits. (on a bottom or back side. Initials would be fine). Exhibits must be ready to be displayed. If a mannequin would enhance the display of your exhibit, please furnish if possible. We do not have mannequins available and would display on a hanger. If you have a special hanger to display your garment on, please include it with your exhibit. Mark the hanger with your name.

8. Exhibits that need to be assembled for display are the responsibility of the exhibitor. Please make sure that items that are glued, are glued securely. Gluing

has a tendency to separate during the fair. If this should occur and it affects the displaying of the exhibit it will be removed from the floor and stored in a safe area.

9. **ART WORK**- All pieces must be framed and ready for hanging. Hanging apparatus must be attached to the frame with wire, **NOT TAPE**. Since we have combined the youth and open class departments into one building, and in order to accommodate all exhibits, the maximum size of artwork can be no larger than 24 inches in any direction. If you have a piece larger than 24" in any direction, call to get a release of the size but you must use your own display. We do not recommend the use of glass but if you feel that your piece should be displayed with glass, we suggest that you use Plexiglass for display purpose only. You may display at your own risk. We are not responsible for glass breakage.

YOUTH ARTWORK-Use the above rules. If your piece is not framed, it must be at least matted. It is suggested that a 14 ply matting be used for framing. **No construction paper for matting.**

LITERARY- Literary consists of Prose- writing using ordinary language or speech, which is no poetry. Poetry- The art of writing stories, poems, and thoughts into verse. No more than two pages in length. **Presentation is a main factor in judging.**

10. Exhibits may be mailed pre-paid to Michigan State Fair (above address). **Enclose the entry form with your exhibit. Please mail the original with the W-9 form by the entry deadline (July 31).** Arrangements may be made to have the exhibit returned by U.P.S. (a \$7.00 mailing fee per exhibitor, 5 pounds and under. Exhibits weighing 5 pounds and over \$10.00). Packing must be suitable for returning. **All efforts will be made to return your exhibit in the same container.** If an item is hand delivered but a return mailing is requested, providing a container would be appreciated. Please allow at least 14 days after the closing day of the fair for the return of your exhibit. (Mail back fees have increased because of the increase in postage.)

11. Each Gold Ribbon exhibitor will be mailed 2 free gate passes to the Michigan State Fair, August 28- September 7, 2009 once the entry form has been processed.
