PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

1. Animals do not need to be owned by the exhibitor.
2. Gate set up is Sunday, August 1st at 1:00 p.m. **ALL CLUBS NEED TO BE REPRESENTED!!** Take down will be immediately after animals are released on Sunday. **ALL CLUBS NEED TO BE REPRESENTED FOR THIS ALSO!!** Please bed with STRAW!
3. All animals must be identified on a separate 4-H ID sheet obtained from the Extension Office and must be filed at the 4-H Office by **July 15th** of the project year.
4. Animals **must** have the RFID tag. A clear picture of the 4-Her and the animal, a side view, is required with each ID card. **INCOMPLETE/LATE CARDS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED!!!**
5. **All animals shown must be a straight dairy breed, a cross breed will not be allowed in the dairy classes.**
6. Entry times for dairy (not milking) will be **ONLY FROM 8:00 A.M. UNTIL 2:00 P.M.** on Monday. Exception: Entries for milking dairy will be **ONLY ENTERED FROM 8:00 A.M. UNTIL 12 NOON** on Wednesday. If you are unable to make this time schedule, arrangements must be made with the Dairy Superintendent.
7. Milking times will be approximately 6:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. with the exception of Wednesday Night. If you are milking 3 times a day, please contact the Superintendent.
8. An affidavit must be signed and turned in the dairy Superintendent that the milk cows have not had rBST and if rBST has been used the milk cannot be put in the bulk tank at the Fair.
9. All cards above animals **must** have exhibitors name, club, and any other vital information per animal and be in place by 5:00 p.m. Monday.
10. Identification of all animals will be done on Monday of fair week.
11. The following classes must be pre-registered by 4:30 p.m., Wednesday of Fair Week: Exhibitor's Herd, Produce of Dam, Daughter and Dam and Club Herd.
12. An exhibitor must show in both showmanship and the breed classes. Exhibitors may be asked to participate with their animal in a dairy judging activity during the Fair.
13. No exhibitor may show more than one animal in each class. Exceptions may be made by superintendent in event of multiple births. Exception may also be made in age cow classes when animal has been shown as a previous project animal.
14. When animal leaves the show ring it may not return for further judging in that class.
15. Animal must be three months old as of show date to be eligible to be shown. Example: If show date is August 26, animal must have been born by May 26. Animals not being shown are not allowed in the exhibit area.
16. First year dairy exhibitor may exhibit one calf or yearling heifer. NOT to exceed 18 months of age at beginning of Fair.
17. **Exhibitor may exhibit one animal for each year completed in the dairy project not to exceed a maximum of four animals. No exhibitor may show more than four animals. Produce of Dam and Daughter of Dam must be shown by the same exhibitor.**
18. Exhibitor is urged to continue with the same project animals.
19. **USE OF DRUGS/MEDICATION MUST BE CLEARED THROUGH THE SUPERINTENDENT.**
20. **SUPERINTENDENT HAS DISCRETION TO COMBINE OR SPLIT CLASSES DEPENDING ON THE NUMBER ENTERED IN CLASSES.**
21. **DAUGHTER AND DAM CLASS:** Dam must be a project animal and her own daughter, any age, three months or over. Judged on basis of improvement of daughter over dam.
22. **PRODUCE OF DAM CLASS:** Two female offspring of a project animal.
23. **EXHIBITOR'S HERD:** Three animals, any age, owned by one member. Animals must have been shown in individual classes.
24. **CLUB HERD:** Three animals, any age, can be mixed breed, owned by three different members of the same club.
25. **PRODUCTION RECORDS CLASS:** Dairy production records will be evaluated based on Total Dollar Value of current completed lactation on the official D.H.I.A. record complete lifetime sheet. Animal must be 2 years old and milking 40 days.
 - a. Awards will be presented to the highest Total \$ Value on current completed lactation on the official D.H.I.A. record complete lifetime sheet. Production awards will be offered for the top three highest producing cows sponsored by local dairy infrastructures.
 - b. Records and dairy production form must be presented to Show Superintendent by 12:00 Noon on Thursday of Fair.

c. Members must have owned the animal for entire lactation period to be eligible for class.

26. An individual may compete for and receive the Dairy Showmanship trophy more than once. The winner will compete in Sweepstakes competition. However, the Sweepstakes trophy may be won only once within a division (Novice, Junior and Senior-total of three). In the event the member winning the showmanship trophy has won the Sweepstakes within that division, the Reserve Champion Showman may compete (or so on down to the next placing who has not won the Sweepstakes trophy).

27. Exhibitors must care for their animal before 10 a.m. each day. It is **required** that animals be fed, watered, and cared for so that exhibit is ready for display by 10 a.m. daily.

28. Individual exhibitors are responsible for keeping their animals in a clean, presentable condition at all times during their stay at the Fair. How you keep your animal(s) reflects on you as an individual club member. Clubs may have a duty roster in which members take turns at keeping the club area neat and manure removed. Manure is to be placed in the pits provided and piled as high as possible in order to limit area required for storage.

DAIRY AWARDS CEREMONIAL MILK BUCKETS

A Ceremonial Milk Bucket will be sold at the sale for both the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion cows. 4% commission from each cow will go to the Sanilac County 4-H Livestock Committee. Remaining proceeds from the sale of the milk buckets will go 50% to the 4-H member owning the cow and 50% to the Sanilac County 4-H Dairy Development Committee. A ceremonial milk bucket will be provided to the buyers.

SECTION 1
SHOWMANSHIP

1. For showmanship score card, refer to Bulletin 4-H 1074.

a. Sportsmanship and personal appearance **WHITE SHIRT (NO TANK TOP), TROUSERS, WALKING SHORTS, OR SKIRT REQUIRED- NO TENNIS SHOES** also count.

2. In each showmanship class the winner will be awarded a show halter.

3. Age is determined as of January 1, of current year.

4. Rosettes 1st- 6th in all classes except 0003, 0007, 0011, 0012, and 0013

5. Champion Dairy Showmanship will be eligible to show in the Sweepstakes Showmanship. Sweepstakes entrants will be chosen from winners of respective age groups. Superintendent will complete Sweepstakes form listing exhibitor's name, club name and age division represented for each species.

6. The Superintendent may adjust class size.

SECTION 2
DAIRY BREEDS

1. Rosettes 1st- 6th place will be awarded except in Championship and Production classes.
2. Trophies will be awarded for each age division in the Holstein area, but not for the Junior and Senior Champions.
3. Trophies will be awarded to Junior and Senior Champions for all other breeds, but not the individual age divisions.
4. The awarding of a trophy for Champion for a small number of animals of a specific breed class will be left to the discretion of the judge.

2. Awards will be presented to the highest Total Dollar Value of last completed lactation. Production awards will be offered for the top 3 highest producing cows sponsored by local dairy infrastructures.
3. D.H.I.A. records and dairy production forms must be presented to the show superintendent by 12:00 noon on Thursday (Show Day) of fair week. Rosettes will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in classes 0180- 0183.
