COGGINS TEST POLICY 4-H HORSE SHOWS

A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST is required to show at the Sanilac County 4-H Fair and any Sanilac County 4-H sponsored horse shows.

HORSE PROGRAM RULES

HORSE/PONY REGISTRATION

1. Exhibitor Horse/Pony I.D. Sheet and Contract, and Proof of Immunizations must be received by the Extension Office by May 3rd in order to participate in the championship classes, or be eligible for High Point trophies, or qualify for the State Show.
2. Exhibitors must provide proof of the following immunizations and a negative Coggins test to the Extension Office by May 3rd.

Required:

- a. Eastern and Western Equine Encephalomyelitis
- b. Rhinopneumonitis
- c. Influenza
- d. Tetanus
- e. Negative Coggins Test

Recommended:

- a. Potomac Horse Fever
- b. Rabies
- c. West Nile
- d. Strangles

****Failure to produce proof that your horse/pony received the required immunizations will result in the exhibitor being refused entry in any 4-H horse show in Sanilac County, including fair week****

3. Failure to provide the above information by May 3rd will result in elimination from the Championship Classes, High Point, and State Show.

4. If a horse dies after the May 3rd registration deadline, but prior to the First Qualifier, the exhibitor may still qualify for Championship, High Point, and State Show if the following conditions are met:
 - a. The original horse was registered on or prior to the May 3rd deadline and the contract and proof of immunization was completed.
 - b. The exhibitor must have a veterinary certificate of death or injury with diagnosis listed rendering the horse unable to be shown during the current year or horse committee deemed horse unsafe.
 - c. A new 4-H ID sheet with the new horse listed and receipt of immunizations is completed and turned in

to the Extension Office prior to the first Qualifying Show of the current year.

5. Youth may still replace your horse because of injury, but are not eligible for High Point, Championship Classes, or State Show if the original registration was not completed by May 3rd or if the registration for the replacement horse was not submitted by the first Qualifying Show.
6. But in case of death you are still eligible for High Point, Championship Classes, and State Show. Please see Horse Committee in the case of this to ensure that the correct paperwork is taken care of.
7. The exhibitor will not receive a fair pass unless Horse/Pony ID sheet is turned in to the Extension Office as a project by May 3, 2010.

HORSE/PONY PROJECT GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Exhibitors must have worked with their horse/pony at least 80% of the time and should be fed and cared for by the 4-H member for at least three months, starting no later than May 3rd.
2. All exhibitors are required to do their own feeding, grooming, stall cleaning, and other preparation for the show ring. Professional and excessive adult help will not be tolerated.
3. Only exhibitors are to ride the animal entered as their exhibit. The only exception to this is Cloverbud exhibitors in Cloverbud classes and PEP exhibitors in PEP classes.
4. No riding double, side saddle, or with bareback pads or with halters. No riding bareback except when showing in a bareback class.
5. Horses/ponies are to be ridden in designated areas only. This includes the show arena, practice arena, and at your own risk in the grassy area east of the practice arena.
6. Horses/ponies are to be led to and from the barn. There is no riding until you are east of the Horse Arena, where you may then mount your horse. You must dismount your horse at the east end of the arena, before returning to the barn.
7. Horses/ponies must be led with a proper lead rope, not just the halter.
8. Boots or shoes, with a heel, must be worn whenever working with horses and/or riding.
9. No horse/pony shown at the fair shall be administered any drug/medicine unless prescribed by a veterinarian and cleared through the Horse Committee or Superintendent. Failure to do so may result in disqualification. Refer to Rule #22 under General Rules & Regulations listed on page 17 of the fairbook.
10. Horses/ponies creating a disturbance or problems shall be acted upon by the Horse Committee to ensure the safety of exhibitors, exhibits, and the public.

12. All premiums shall be forfeited if any exhibitor is involved in improper conduct in any exhibit or activity area during the Fair. If deemed necessary, the persons or person will be sent home. The decision to be made by a committee consisting of one 4-H Council member, one Fairboard member, and the involved superintendent(s).

11. *Horse and Pony Project Rules will supersede, and include, all General Rules and Regulations. All decisions by Horse Committee will be final.*

SHOW REQUIREMENTS

1. All participants exhibiting in the Horse/Pony Department are expected to be familiar with the official rules, which are listed in the 4-H Horse and Pony Project Show Rules & Regulations (2006). A copy is available at the Extension Office.
2. Any violation may mean the forfeit of premiums and any awards that the exhibitor has received.
3. Exhibitor's ages are determined as of January 1st of the current year.
 - a. Exhibitor's ages 9- 12 are considered junior exhibitors.
 - b. Exhibitor's ages 13- 19 are considered senior exhibitors.
4. If there are only three 4-H members riding in a class they will either be moved up or down a class, depending on their age, in order for them to compete with more than three people.
5. No one may exhibit more than one horse, unless showing a mare and foal or participating in the standard-bred Project.
6. No horse or pony used as a 4-H project may be shown or handled by more than one exhibitor, unless it is being used by the Sheriff Posse, for PEP classes, or by a Cloverbud participant.
7. No stallions are allowed except during the calendar year in which they are foaled.
8. Premiums will be paid in the following classes: Showmanship, Western Horsemanship, and English Equitation classes.
9. Ponies are determined as 56" and under.
 - a. Ponies will be measured by designated members of the Horse Committee and issued a measurement certificate for the show year prior to competing in any qualifying show and the fair.
 - b. Ponies over age five need only to be measured once to be issued a permanent measurement certificate.
10. All youth, regardless of age, may show a pony.
11. Lame or unruly animals may be excused from any class.

12. All show participants are required to wear ASTM or SEI approved helmets for hunt seat on the flat and over fences, and all gymkhana classes.

13. All classes will be awarded 6 rosettes except championship classes, which will be awarded one Grand Champion trophy and Grand & Reserve Champion rosettes.

14. To participate in the George Sangster you must have won First, Grand or Reserve in showmanship. To participate in the Gordon McVay, you must have won First, Grand or Reserve in either Western or English Equitation. You must ride the seat you won the First, Grand or Reserve in. If you won a first in both English and Western classes, you may choose the seat to ride for the McVay.

15. Large Animal Sweepstakes Showmanship participants will be the High Point Showmanship Exhibitors in these 3 age groups, 16- 19, 13- 15, and 9- 12 years. Time is 10:00 a.m. on Saturday in the Livestock Arena. Contact Tonya Hawken (989) 823-3807 or Jim Mahaffy (810) 376-9244. Guidelines are under Section 104- Showmanship in the fair book. See the Horse Committee Chairman for information.

16. Participants in the Walk/Trot or Green Horse/Pony Walk-Trot classes shall not ride in any other classes that require a third gait or lope. This includes trail, if a lope is required.

17. Participants in the Walk/Trot classes may participate in the showmanship and costume classes.

18. 1st Year members may show in either their age group or the 1st Year Member classes, but not both. Members who show in 1st Year Member classes are not eligible for State Show Delegate, High Point Trophies or Championship Classes. Individuals showing in Walk/Trot or Green Horse/Pony Walk/Trot, or as First Year Members are not eligible to participate in Championship classes.

HIGH POINT ELIGIBILITY

1. Participants must comply with all Registration Project Guidelines as stated above.
2. All exhibitors are required to do their own feeding, grooming, stall cleaning, and other preparation for the show ring. Professional and excessive adult help will not be tolerated.
3. Participants may not collect points in more than one county. Violators will forfeit all points and awards from Sanilac County.
4. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st place= 6 points, 2nd place = 5 points, 3rd place = 4 points, 4th place = 3 points, 5th place = 2 points, 6th place = 1 point. Grand Championships, including Sangster and McVay Grand Champions, will be awarded 4 points and Reserve Champions, including Sangster and McVay Reserve Champions, will be awarded 2 points.
5. Gymkhana points are determined by fastest times. Points are awarded by fastest time in each division

(cloverleaf, flags, keyhole, pole bending, speed & action points will be taken from the best 2 out of 3 shows), not by placings in individual classes.

6. Project books are optional, but will be judged and awarded premiums. Points for project books will count toward High Point and State Show. For project books, points will be awarded as follows: A rating = 6 points, B rating = 4 points, C rating = 2 points. Project books will be turned in on May 1st with Horse ID sign up paper work.

7. All High Point awards and State Show Delegates will be announced at the awards ceremony on Friday night of the fair.

8. In case of a tie, 2 trophies will be awarded in the respective division.

9. Individuals receiving High Point Overall will be excluded from receiving High Point Fair Week Trophies.

10. Trophies will be awarded for **High Point Overall Saddle Seat and High Point Overall Hunt Seat Horse, Western Horse, Western Pony and Saddle and Hunt Seat Pony** to individuals accumulating the most points in approved classes from the qualifying shows and the fair.

11. Trophies will be awarded for **High Point Fair Week for Saddle Seat and Hunt Seat Horse, Western Horse, Western Pony, and Saddle Seat and Hunt Seat Pony**.

12. Points for High Point Fair Week and High Point Overall Saddle Seat and Hunt Seat Horse, Western Horse, Western Pony, and Saddle Seat and Hunt Seat Pony will be accumulated for the following classes: Showmanship, Equitation, Pleasure, English and Western Riding, Championship Classes, Western Reining, Trail, Dressage, and Jumping.

13. Exhibitors must specify at registration whether they want their points to count toward English or Western and ride or show in that specified seat/attire for the following classes: Showmanship, Western/English Riding, and Trail. If not specified, points will be counted as Western.

14. Gymkhana Trophies will be awarded as follows:

- a. The **Charlie Becker** trophy is given to the best horse and rider team based on speed and sportsmanship during fair week.
- b. **High Point Fair Week Gymkhana** trophies will be awarded for the Thursday of fair week speed events. 3 trophies will be awarded: horse division and pony.
- c. **High Point Overall Gymkhana** trophies will be awarded to the individuals who accumulate the most gymkhana points from the qualifying shows and fair week. 3 trophies will be awarded: horse division and pony division.

STATE SHOW QUALIFICATIONS

1. State show delegates will be chosen by the following criteria:

- a. Participant with the highest points total earned from the best 2 of 3 qualifying shows in qualifying classes will be considered for the state show.
- b. Delegates must be 13 years of age by 4-H rules.
- c. Delegates must have **PERSONALLY completed** their work requirements prior to fair week.- See Rule # 5 below.
- d. If there are at least 15 State Show Delegates in a given year, the candidates will be selected from the top point earners. If this number is below 15, candidates will be selected from individuals who were not Delegates during the previous year.
- e. Individuals who are 19 years of age, and have met all qualifications for Delegate, may attend the State Show regardless of whether they have attended the previous year.
- f. Individuals must have 2 consecutive years of showing in Sanilac County 4-H Horse Project area. For example 2006 & 2007. Leaving the fair early will be taken into consideration by the Horse Committee.

2. State Show points are accumulated from the following classes: Fitting and Showing, Equitation, Pleasure, and English/Western Riding, Western Reining, Championship Classes, Trail, Dressage and Record Books.

3. If there is only three 4-H member riding in a class they will either be moved up or down a class, depending on their age, in order for them to compete with more than one person.

4. Gymkhana points will be kept separately for Gymkhana State Delegate(s) based on the best times.
See Rule #1- above

5. Exhibitors wishing to participate in the State Show are required to work one full day at a 4-H sponsored horse show. The work must be completed by the individual, not a parent, etc. Guidelines will be available regarding each task that needs to be fulfilled during a show to assist in the learning process for the members and parents.

- a. Exhibitors may complete their work time in half-day sessions.
- b. Exhibitors may have a parent or representative work for them while they are getting their horse ready and in the ring showing. No more than 3 classes prior to the exhibitors class should the exhibitor be excused. However, they must report back to their work when finished showing to complete their work obligation.
- c. Exhibitors may use volunteer time with the PEP riders, to count toward work time as follows:
4 full sessions if your horse is used = 1 work day;
8 full sessions if you do not bring your horse to use = 1 work day. Contact Shelly at the 4-H

Office to schedule volunteer time at (810) 648-2515.

d. The Horse Committee will keep a list of exhibitors who have put in work time. However, it is your responsibility to request a work receipt, signed by a Committee member, after you have completed a work day. This will eliminate any question or confusion regarding completed work time.

e. See any Horse Committee member to schedule your work time, therefore the member will know ahead of time when and where they should be during the show.

f. Exhibitors may work at any horse committee sponsored show for examples: Qualifiers, Horse Committee Blue Water Show, Fundraiser Show, etc.

6. Individuals showing as 1st Year Members are not eligible for High Point awards, State Show, and Champion Classes.

7. Individuals showing in Walk/Trot or Green Horse/Pony Walk/Trot, are not eligible for High Point awards, State Show, and Championship Classes.

8. ***Every exhibitor is required to show in at least 1 showmanship class in order to be eligible for the state show.***

9. If there is a tie, both exhibitors will be sent if possible. However, the Horse Committee reserves the right to handle each tie on an individual basis.

FAIRWEEK- BARN REQUIREMENTS

There will be an informational meeting at the Announcer's Stand on the 1st Sunday of fair week at 6:00 p.m. for all horse exhibitors, parents, and club leaders. A club leader from each club must be present to assure compliance from exhibitors in their club and attendance will be taken. Fair week rules are subject to changes and any changes and new information will be discussed at this meeting.

1. Exhibitors must agree to leave their horse on the fair grounds from the time of entry until 9:00 a.m. on Sunday unless they have arranged for early dismissal with the Superintendent of Horses and the Horse Committee. (See Contract on reverse of Horse/Pony ID Sheet).

Approval must be given for 4-H Fair exhibits if they need to be removed from the fairgrounds prior to the Sunday release times. That approval is only for a sick animal or youth OR a family emergency. If approval is not given and exhibits are removed, prior to the release times on Sunday, all awards, premiums, trophies, ribbons, and State Show delegate opportunities will be revoked for any and all exhibits that are removed from the 4-H Fairgrounds prior to the release time.

In all instances, the **General Superintendent** for the project area must be notified to initiate the request. After discussing the situation with the Superintendent,

an early removal request form must be picked up at the Fair Office to proceed with the request. A request for an exhibit early removal must be completed and approved. That approval must come from the project area committee, including the General Superintendent.

RETURN THE FORM TO 4-H OFFICE IMMEDIATELY AFTER SIGNING.

2. Leaders must have stall sheets in to the Extension Office by July 1st. No barn sheets will be accepted prior to May 1st.

3. No horses will be allowed in the barn before Noon on the 1st Sunday of Fair.

4. Decoration of horse barns may start at 9:00 a.m.

5. No club is to enter horses in any barn without having checked in with the Horse Committee Representative.

6. A club leader or representative must be on the grounds to check in their club's horses on Sunday of Fair.

7. The club leader is responsible for determining which horses are compatible and assigning stalls for their area.

8. A club leader or representative is responsible for escorting members to their assigned stalls.

9. Once a horse enters a stall, it cannot be moved to another stall without approval of the Horse Committee.

10. Mares and nursing foals will be given first priority for stalls.

11. Hay bags must be secured to the overhead eye bolts in an approved manner. A Horse Committee Representative will visit each barn to demonstrate approved methods.

12. Water buckets with bails must be hung from the bucket hardware in stalls or attached to eye bolts with double-ended snaps. Water or feed buckets without bails may not stay in the stalls at night without approval of the Horse Committee.

13. All hardware added to stalls must have prior approval from a Horse Committee member.

14. Enter and exit the barn using the door closest to your stall.

15. Stalls must be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. each day.

16. Keep your aisle area clear of tack and tools. Sweep shavings and debris frequently. The aisle is for the public to walk in to view the animals.

17. It is your responsibility to clean up any mess your horse makes in the aisle or on the asphalt of the fairgrounds.

18. Saddle your horse in the stall whenever possible. The general public is not accustomed to horses.

19. If possible, have a club representative available in the barn at all times.

20. Do not place a sign on your stall stating 'Horse Bites'. You may however, place a sign stating 'Please Do Not Pet This Horse'.
21. A Horse Committee member will inspect the barns at closing time or approximately 11:00 p.m. each night. Please have a club leader or representative available in the event some corrective action regarding a stall or horse is needed. A Horse Committee member will not enter a stall except in an emergency.
22. In the event of an emergency, contact one of the Barn Superintendents or a Horse Committee Member.
23. In the event of human injury, contact any Horse Committee member. Robin Lee and Greg Ferriby are the designated Emergency Response Personnel. They will assess the situation until the ambulance arrives. An Incident Report must be filled out immediately.
24. Horses cannot be taken from the barn on Friday while the livestock sale is taking place. (approximately 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.)
25. After 7:00 p.m. on Friday, other exhibitors showing another members horse in the open show on Saturday, may ride in the arena.
26. All horses shall be back in the barn by 9:30 p.m. each night. No horses shall be taken out of the barns after 9:30 p.m. Exception may be granted only by the Horse Committee or Superintendent.
27. The Sunday of check out, a club leader must be present in the barn until all exhibitors are checked out by the Horse Committee.
28. Prior to check out, stalls must be cleaned and swept out.

CLOVERBUD GUIDELINES

All state 4-H Cloverbud horse guidelines will be followed as written in the 4-H Horse & Pony Project Show Rules and Regulations 4-H 1145 (rule book).

1. Cloverbuds may show any horse or pony that is suitable to their experience and ability. This includes an older exhibitor's horse, a parent's, siblings, or any other suitable horse.
2. All Cloverbud classes will be held Monday of fair week.
3. Cloverbud exhibitors may trailer their horses in Monday for the classes, but must have their horses off the fair grounds by 8:00 p.m. Monday evening.
4. A horse may be shown by more than 1 Cloverbud participant, but not in the same class.
5. No horses hauled into the fairgrounds for cloverbud classes may be stalled at the fairgrounds. However, Cloverbud participants may show an older exhibitor's horse that will be stabled on the fairground during the week of fair.
6. Cloverbud exhibitors are required to follow all of the fair guidelines and requirements, including Coggins and shot requirements.

7. Cloverbud exhibitors must be registered and have I.D. sheets and cleanliness policy in by May 3rd.
8. All Cloverbud exhibitors must have a parent or guardian present at all times when in contact with their horse or pony.
9. All Cloverbuds must wear an ASTM or SEI approved helmet at all times when mounted.
10. Cloverbuds ages 5 and 6 **must** have a parent or guardian present in the arena while the child is showing.
11. Parents of Cloverbuds ages 7 and 8 **may** be in the arena, but **must** be near the arena while the child is showing.
12. Cloverbud participants may show in the 5- 8 year old showmanship class, and the lead-line class, *or* the walk-trot class. Cloverbud participants may not show in both lead-line and walk-trot classes.
13. All Cloverbud exhibitors will receive a ribbon for participation.
